 - 6. Visit various program shops on campus to meet students.
- Management and data responsibilities:
 - 1. Use Retention Module to identify students and to assign key support staff for intervention follow-up
 - 2. Secure and schedule test proctors for students with accommodations as needed
 - 3. Utilize Jenzabar to gather pertinent information related to student demographics and performance
 - 4. Work collaboratively w/ Retention team to meet student needs w/ thorough, frequent contact
 - 7. Facilitate Retention team meetings with current information at Counselor/Disabilities Coordinator's direction
 - 8. Prepare and present academic seminars as needed, including beyond the work day.
 - 9. Maintain contact with students on probation and those with grades below a C; assist them in creating plans for academic success, including emergency triage and teaching
 - 10. Test accommodations coordinator: set times/location for testing accommodations for individual students; secure test proctor or act as proctor when necessary; coordinate delivery and return of test with each professor and maintain testing room with necessary supplies for student use

Preferred requirements include a Master's Degree in Education or a related field and experience with students in an educational setting.

Preferred skills include strong positive communication skills; computer skills in Microsoft and LMS Systems.
