Beginning August 2017, the instructor will teach courses that builds upon the fundamentals of web application development (including application integration methodologies, building and consuming web services via REST API), the data analysis process, generating reports, workplace communications (including workplace etiquette, conflict/resolution, managing project expectations, and client satisfaction), and software engineering principles. The instructor will also curate and improve course materials to meet the needs of employers today, and continually update for the needs of tomorrow.

Traits of a successful candidate:

- Experience building or maintaining software that provides and/or consumes a web service API
- Proficient with object oriented software design principles
- Has been exposed to all aspects of the software development life cycle SDLC
- Excellent communication skills with coworkers, peers, and clients
- Has been a project/team lead or manager of a software development team
- Experience collecting data, cleansing data, and generating reports for data informed decision making
- Minimum requirements include an Associate Degree with at least five years of software engineering experience and completion of a Bachelor's Degree within five years contingent upon hiring.
